二、執行情形

(一) 玉山學者工作項目及內容

何漢理教授自 107 年 8 月 1 日起聘任為短期玉山學者，其聘任申請時承諾協助之工作項目及內容為：

- 1、提供短期課程或工作坊
- 2、指導學生論文研究
- 3、協助本校成立跨院系所教師組成研究團隊，探討政治學領域相關重要研究議題。
- 4、參與本校舉辦之會議，並協助編輯英文期刊或專書。
- 5、協助本校與美國之大學的學術交流與合作。

(二) 玉山學者團隊合作情形

何漢理教授自 107 年 8 月 1 日起聘任為短期玉山學者後，即開始與本校社科院、國際事務學院、國際關係研究中心，以及中央研究院等單位熟悉或新認識之學者及研究生等接觸，協助成立研究亞太地區中等強國(Middle Powers)如何因應處於中、美兩大國競合關係轉變之議題的團隊，並以舉辦國際會議及編輯相關議題專書為目標。

(三) 績效報告

何漢理教授自 107 年 8 月 1 日起聘任為短期玉山學者，已利用 107 年度暑期及 107 學年地一學期期間陸續來台，並共停留約四個月。在台期間，其主要工作內容包括協助教學、研究及推動學術交流等項目。以下分就 Harding 教授本學年在台期間，對主要隸屬之本校社會科學學院及本校其他單位，已完成或進行之工作項目及內容，分述如下：

1、社會科學學院

- (1) 教學及指導學生：Harding 教授於 107 學年第一學期為社科院亞太研究英語博士學位學程 (IDAS)、亞太研究碩士學位學程 (IMAS) 開授 1 學分之「中美關係：由夥伴到競合 (The U.S. and China from Partners to Competitors)」課程，並有十三位研究生選修此課程。有數位修習此課程之同學後，在 Harding 教授指導下，將繼續研究亞太地區中等強國(Middle Powers)如何因應處於中、美兩大國競合關係轉變之議題。
- (2) 協助規劃 2018 年 IDAS 舉辦國際研討會，並擔任此研討會之主題演講人，發表“Contesting the Center: Who Will be Asia’s Central Kingdom in the Post-Modern World”。
- (3) 協助社科院與美國維吉尼亞大學 (University of Virginia) 之人文及科學學院建立正式學術交流關係。

2、本校其他單位

- (1) 多次參與本校國際事務學院、國際關係研究中心、創新國際學院等單位之活動，包括演講、發表會議論文，以及教授短期課程等。並因與本校國際關係研究中心有長期合作關係，故也將協助該中心發行之重要英文期刊 Issues and Studies 恢復列名 SSCI。
- (2) 協助本校與維吉尼亞大學簽署校級之正式學術交流關係合約，以促成兩校師生交換及交流。維吉尼亞大學長期為 US News and Report 評等為美國最佳公立大學之一，故政大與維大如能簽署學術交流合約，當屬本校一重要國際合作成果。
