(一)玉山(青年)學者工作項目及內容(如教學工作或研究計畫等)

何漢理教授自 107 年 8 月 1 日起聘任為短期玉山學者，聘期為三年，其聘任申請時承諾協助之工作項目及內容為：

- 1、 提供短期課程或工作坊
- 2、 指導學生論文研究
- 3、 協助本校成立跨院系所教師組成研究團隊，探討政治學領域相關重要研究議題。
- 4、 參與本校舉辦之會議，並協助編輯英文期刊或專書。
- 5、 協助本校與美國之大學的學術交流與合作。

(二)玉山學者團隊合作情形(請敘明團隊成員及合作方式)(玉山青年學者免填)

何漢理教授自 107 年 8 月 1 日起聘任為短期玉山學者後，即開始與本校社科院、國際事務學院、國際關係研究中心、創新國際學院，以及中央研究院等單位熟悉或新認識之學者及研究生等接觸，協助成立研究亞太地區中等強國(Middle Powers)如何因應處於中、美兩大國競合關係轉變之議題的團隊，並以舉辦國際會議及編輯相關議題專書為目標。

(三)績效說明(請說明達到量化或質化之具體成果與績效、對學校發展之具體助益等)

何漢理教授自 108 年 8 月 1 日起至 109 年 7 月 31 日，停留台灣超過四個月的時間。在台期間，其主要工作內容包括協助教學、研究及推動學術交流等項目。以下分就 Harding 教授本學年在台期間，對主要隸屬之本校社會科學學院及本校其他單位，已完成或進行中之工作項目及內容，分述如下：

1、社會科學學院

- (1) 指導學生：協助成立並指導學生研究亞太地區中等強國(Middle Powers)如何因應處於中、美兩大國競合關係轉變之議題。
- (2) 在國際學程發表“Change and Continuity in U.S. Policy toward Taiwan”演講。
- (3) 協助社科院與美國維吉尼亞大學(University of Virginia)之人文及科學學院建立正式學術交流關係。

2、本校其他單位

- (1) 多次參與本校國際事務學院、國際關係研究中心、創新國際學院等單位之活動，包括演講、發表會議論文，以及教授短期課程等。
- (2) 教學及指導學生：Harding 教授於 108 學年暑假期間為創新國際學院

- (3) 協助本校與維吉尼亞大學簽署校級之正式學術交流關係合約，以促成兩校師生交換及交流。維吉尼亞大學長期為 US News and Report 評等為美國最佳公立大學之一，故政大與維大如能簽署學術交流合約，當屬本校一重要國際合作成果。
